Charles “Chuck” Hall Daffin, II, 71, of Charlotte, died peacefully January 18, 2013 at his home. He was born on November 7, 1941 in Petersburg, VA to the late Charles Hall Daffin and Dorothy Daffin LaRue (as well as his step-father William S. Randall).
