For 84 years, the Owen and Johnston families were blessed to have Roberta Owen Johnston in their lives. She met her Lord & Savior on June 9, 2015. Roberta was born on February 9, 1931 in Wheeling, West Virginia, graduated from Nott Terrace High School in Schenectady, New York, and then went to nursing school at the University of Rochester. She was an energetic RN in the nursery of Strong Memorial Hospital, where she met her beloved husband of 63 years, Dr. Harvey Johnston, who still resides at the home.

Roberta was a 30 years volunteer with the Loaves and Fishes Pantry located in Holy Comforter Episcopal Church, and a longtime volunteer in the kitchen of Mallard Creek Presbyterian Church's Wednesday Night Youth Program.
