Eleanor Mozeley Plummer, 87, of Charlotte died January 3, 2019. She was born on April 5, 1931 in Mecklenburg County to the late Ray and Velsie Mae Mozeley. She worked as a server in the cafeteria at Oakdale School and then managed the commissary for PCA International for over 15 years. Eleanor was a member of Pleasant Grove U.M.C. and the Covenant Sunday School Class. She was the oldest living member of the American Legion Post 353 Women's Auxiliary.

She was preceded in death by her husband Boyd and all of her siblings. She is survived by her sons, Mike Plummer of Charlotte, Rick Plummer of Chatham, IL and Gene Plummer and wife Kelly of Crumpler, NC; 9 grandchildren and 8 great-grandchildren.

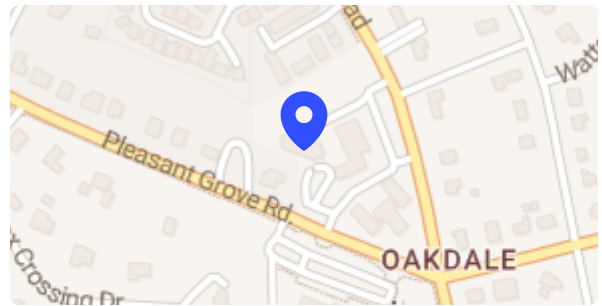

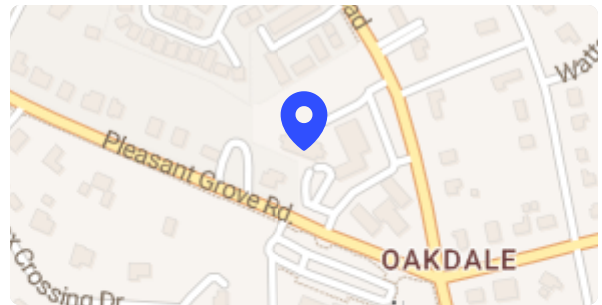

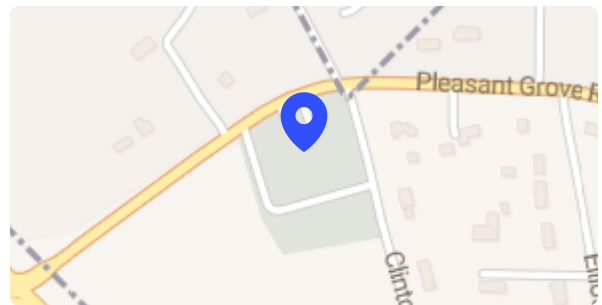
