**D**r. Calvin Brian Cameron, 68 of Mooresville died June 26, 2019.

He was born on August 6, 1950 in Winnipeg, Canada to the late William and Merveen Cameron. He started his career as a pediatric anesthesiologist at University of Manitoba, Children's Hospital, then worked at the University of Minnesota. In 2003, he joined Providence Anesthesiology Associates, Novant Hospital.

Survivors include his wife Joanne Clarke Cameron; daughters, Jennie Cameron of Brentwood, TN and Meagan Greene and husband Casey of Ft. Mill, SC; and 7 grandchildren. He is preceded in death by his daughters Allison and Jill.

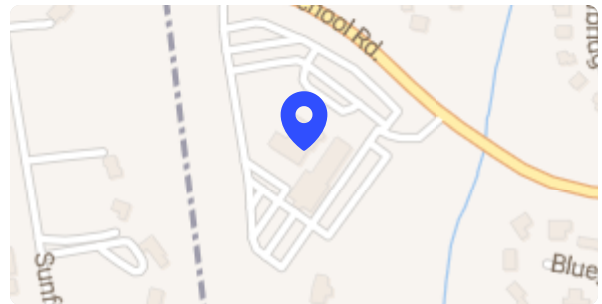

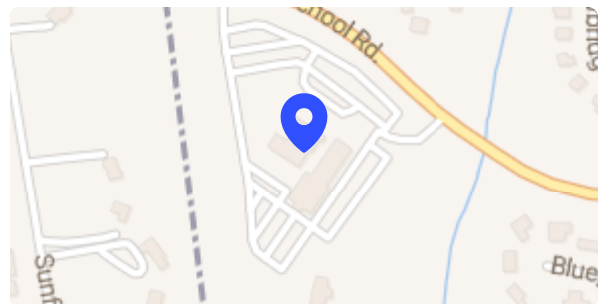

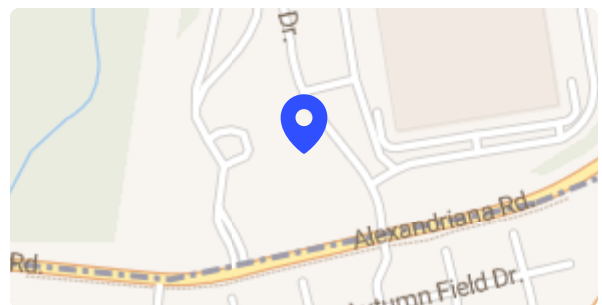
