Holmes Mercer Davis, age 82, of Huntersville died peacefully on October 10, 2020 at Lake Norman Regional Medical Center. Mercer was born on April 18, 1938 in Norfolk, VA to the late Joseph and Margaret Davis. He worked as a Senior Executive V.P. in the Banking Industry, then for First Union, which is now Wells Fargo. He'd proudly served his country in the U.S.A.F.

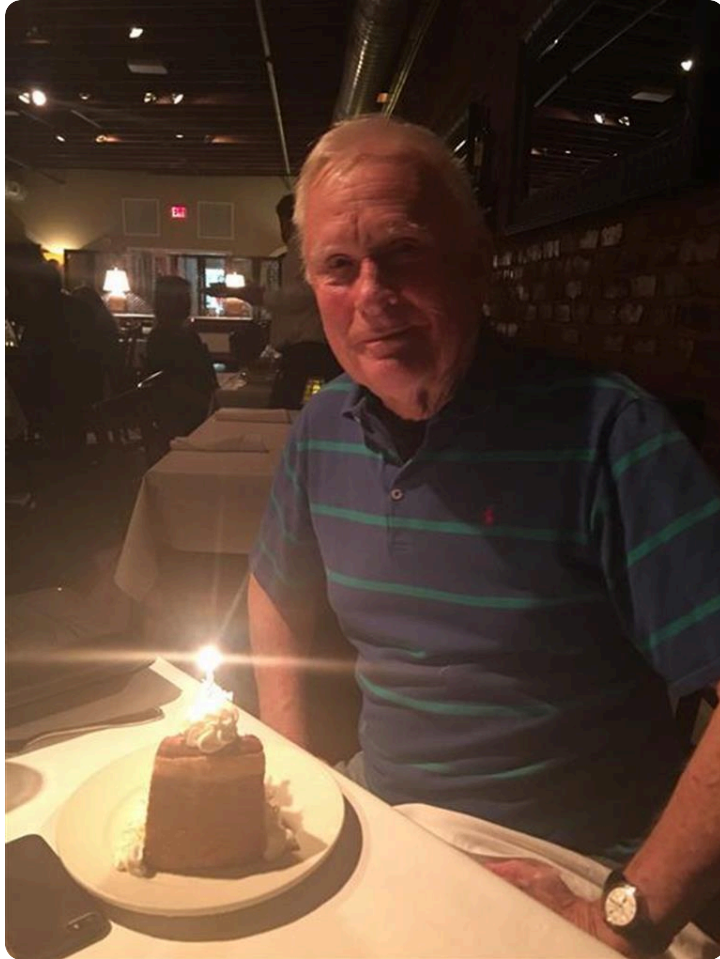
