Ted Alley, 85, of Cleveland, NC, passed away Wednesday, October 14, 2020.

Ted was a native of Huntersville, NC. He was a retired JV Baseball Coach for North Mecklenburg High School, having previously coached community Little League, Pony League, and American Legion Baseball. Ted was an avid lover of baseball not only coaching but also playing the game. His real love of the game was teaching the kids. Ted loved singing, had his own band, and performed many years as the front man at Lake Norman Music Hall. He briefly served in the U.S. Air Force. Ted loved his family, his God, and his friends. His pride and joy was his children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Ted was preceded in death by his parents, Harley and Ollie Alley, and a sister, Linda Erwin.
