James Funeral Home of Huntersville is serving the family.

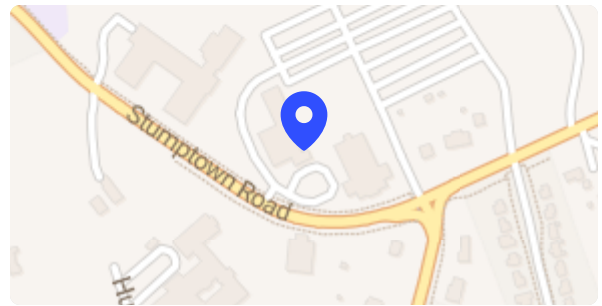

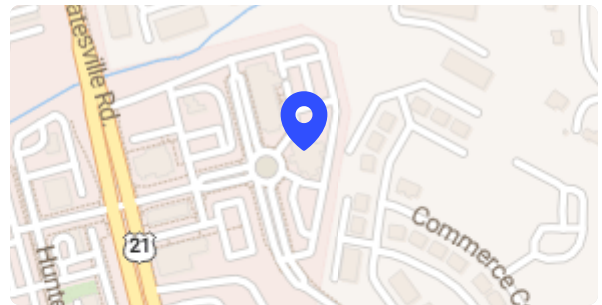
