Michael Meredith Quickel died on September 17, 2021 in Huntersville, N.C., after a long decline following a 2019 stroke.

Pop was the 2005 Builder of the Year. He was the husband who so often held his wife's hand and never paused when a new plant needed to be added in her garden. The dad who always said, "Just try it once." The father patiently waiting as his child snuck in at 5am so he knew they were safely home. The Officiant during the family's annual Easter egg hunt and a fierce competitor in the Gentleman Contests as he taught his grandsons about good manners.

There is a full net of friends and church family who love and respect him as intensely as he loved and respected them. From the small groups and Christmas galas at church to singing favorite hymns and weekend getaways with friends, he showed all of us what

goodness meant, what steadfast love meant and how to be strong in the face of something hard.

In the final reflection of him, we can only say, job well done, Pop. Job well done.
